

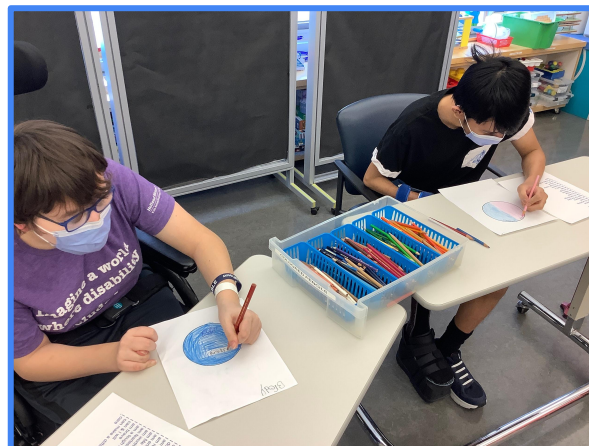

### Hospital Client Classroom (HCC) Programs

Bloorview School provides educational programs  
for students who require intensive rehabilitation as  
a result of surgery, chronic illness, acquired brain  
injury and for students who have complex medical  
needs.

Educational programs are available for Holland  
Bloorview inpatients or day patients on the  
following units:

- Brain Injury Rehab Team (BIRT)
- Complex and Continuing Care (CCC)
- Specialized Orthopedic and Developmental  
Rehab (SODR)

The length of stay and school enrolment depend  
on the student's medical and therapy needs and  
rate of recovery. Bloorview School does not  
determine intake and discharge dates.

In each classroom, a qualified special education  
teacher and support staff provide educational  
programs for students based on The Ontario  
Curriculum.

HCC classroom placements are available to  
students ages four to twenty-one. The  
educational environment complements the  
rehabilitation process for each student.

### School Year

Bloorview School operates on the traditional  
school year. Registration begins the Tuesday  
after Labour Day and classes end the last week of  
June.

## Daily Learning Opportunities

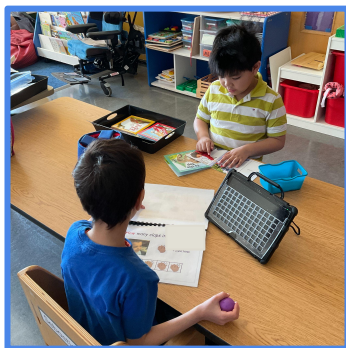
Participation in the school day varies from student to student and is based on individual needs and therapy schedules. Programming is focused on Math and Language. Other opportunities may include Arts, Physical Education, Leadership, and Advocacy and visits to the Library Learning Commons.

## School Planning

School planning takes place with input from the family, the home school and in collaboration with the interdisciplinary team from Holland Bloorview.

It may include:

- individual educational assessments
- development of an Individual Education Plan (IEP)
- academic programming with accommodations and/or modifications
- alternative curriculum
- provincial report card



## Transition

The successful transition of a student to a community school is part of the discharge planning process. In some cases, the services of a School Transition Liaison Teacher may be assigned to facilitate a student's educational transition. In collaboration with the Holland Bloorview team, the role of the School Transition Liaison may include consultative support to students, families, classroom teachers and school board educators.
