

Bloorview School Authority Integrated Education and Therapy Program Eligibility

All students admitted to Bloorview School are registered clients for Holland Bloorview Kids Rehabilitation Hospital (HBKRRH) or, for York Region students, a client of Children's Treatment Network (CTN) and have a primary diagnosis of a physical disability and other associated complex needs.

Priority is given to applicants who have the potential to access the Ontario curriculum and who require a multidisciplinary approach for education and therapy.

The potential student:

- Demonstrates complex needs in **two or more** of the following areas
 - Physiotherapy
 - Occupational Therapy
 - Speech and Language Therapy
- Is of legal school age (at least four years of age by December 31), has the ability to tolerate a full day in a classroom setting and can attend to a range of activities for a short period of time.
- Is currently and actively participating in and has demonstrated growth in two or more of the following therapies: speech and language therapy, occupational therapy or physical therapy and has shown the ability to integrate skills taught into daily activities.
- Demonstrates the ability to indicate, through a communication strategy (e.g. body movement; verbal words; eye gaze; speech generating devices; picture communication) the following:
 - yes and no responses
 - communication of choices

Bloorview School Authority is an educational facility that provides innovative school programs to children and youth with special needs.

Every year hundreds of children and young people from across Ontario benefit from our individualized educational programs, which are set up in conjunction with ongoing therapeutic and medical care. Students may be clients, inpatients or day patients of Holland Bloorview Kids Rehabilitation Hospital.



Integrated Education and Therapy

The Integrated Education and Therapy Program (IET) is an interdisciplinary early intervention program for children with a range of physical and/or communication disabilities.

Physical, occupational and speech therapies are integrated into the child's day as part of the educational programming. The therapy is provided by professional therapists working in a team setting with special education teachers and educational assistants. This multi-disciplinary team collaborate to establish individual learning and therapy goals and share the responsibility of programming for the goals of each student.

Classrooms are set up in a Universal Design for Learning model creating an inclusive environment. Appropriately designed space, furniture and equipment, augmentative and alternative communication systems, allow the child to gain the greatest benefit from the teaching and learning process. Furthermore, we are committed to developing 21st century learning opportunities for our students, which include critical thinking, communication, collaboration, creativity and citizenship. Our goal is to provide students with digital tools to enhance their learning in conjunction with excellent pedagogy. Students have access to iPads, Promethean Interactive Panels, and computers.

This early learning environment maximizes a child's potential in communication, intellectual, physical and social skills development. Each child is encouraged to develop self-esteem, self-advocacy, independence and personal responsibility.

An Individual Education Plan is developed by the interdisciplinary team in consultation with the family to outline the strengths and needs of the student and to describe specific modifications, accommodations and strategies necessary to build success.

A school team supported by a School Transition Liaison Teacher collaborates with the community school boards to ensure a successful transition when the student leaves Bloorview School.



Primary Programming

Bloorview School Authority offers a unique setting for students in Kindergarten to Grade One. The full day program is based on the Ontario Curriculum for Kindergarten and Grade One. Our approach is holistic and child-centered and based on the students' individual strengths and needs. Our small classes allow for an academic focus on the acquisition of early literacy and numeracy skills to create the foundation for early learning. Library, music, visual arts, adapted physical education and aquatics enrich the weekly school timetable.
